The competition is open to persons who meet the requirements set in forth in the Act on Higher Education of July 20, 2018 (consolidated text: Journal of Laws 2018, item 1668, as amended)

The candidate for the adjunct (assistant professor) position should possess at least a PhD degree, specialize in a broadly-defined finance (including corporate finance and financial management). The candidate should also have an experience in conducting research in the indicated field supported by publications in recognized peer-reviewed journals. Teaching experience (including in English) in the mentioned subjects is desirable. It is expected that the person employed in an adjunct position will: 1) conduct research in the area of interest of the Chair of Banking, Finance and Accounting at WNE UW; 2) teach classes at the first and second level of study (including classes in English); 3) participate in scientific and educational projects carried out by the Chair of Banking, Finance and Accounting WNE UW.
